Demise of parking lot marks start of work on Math-Science Building

The demise of another parking lot heralds the beginning of construction of the new Math-Sciences building.

The four-storied structure with a basement for utilities will fill the hole between the Chemistry building and Ryon Lab.

The top three floors will primarily be offices with a few conference and seminar rooms located around a donut hall plan, like that of Rayzor Hall. The ground floor will be used for classes in the several large seminar rooms.

Designed by Pierce & Pierce, the architecture will match the Biology and Geology buildings, with the traditional brick and modern sun-louvers. But unlike its mates, the Math-Sciences Building will not have exterior walkways.

The entrance will face the Science Quadrangle.

The parking lot, where the construction is now, will be changed to a limited use, and the general plan of peripheral parking will be extended. The cost of the new Math-Sciences Bldg. will be about \$1.5 million and is to be completed in mid-1968.
