Welcome to the Fall 2009 Chamber Music Festival: Spotlight on Beethoven and His Time. There is, in my view, nothing more life-affirming than the music of Beethoven. It has been such a pleasure these last few months to focus our work on this master and his colleagues. I don't remember a semester when there has been so much eagerness and energy in the program! You will be hearing music from Beethoven's earliest years (the Trio in G Major for flute, bassoon, and piano written when he was sixteen), through the "heroic" middle years of the Razumovsky quartets, the Op. 70 piano trios and "Archduke," to his late period masterpieces Op. 132 and Op. 135 (his last completed work before his death).

Today is certainly a celebration of not only this great music, but also the thousands of hours spent by the talented students and inspiring faculty preparing these performances. The day is long, but filled with such joy and commitment, that I know you will be as enthralled as I.

I have one final thought. When we listed the festival as "Spotlight on Beethoven and His Time," it occurred to me that Beethoven's presence is felt more forcefully now than even during his own lifetime. It seems that there is no other composer that casts such a long shadow. Herr Beethoven, so fully in our midst today, we honor you!
