Caroline is a member of the Greater Houston Youth Orchestra and has participated in the Houston Youth Symphony, the All-Region, Area, and All-State Symphony Orchestras. She was the second place winner of the 1995 Houston Music Teachers Association Competition, the fifth place recipient of the Greater Houston Youth Orchestra Scholarship Competition, and has been named the Klein Independent School District Outstanding Musician the past six years. Upon graduation, Caroline hopes to continue her musical studies at Rice University.

OLIVER RICHARDS has been studying piano for seven years, the past three with Dean Shank. He is thirteen years old and in the seventh grade at St. John's School. Oliver also has studied viola for the past one and a half years with Judy Offman. He is principal violist with the Houston Youth Symphony's Philharmonic Orchestra. He also was selected to play the viola for the Junior High All-Region Symphony Orchestra. The past summer Oliver won the Piano Concerto Competition in the Junior division at the Interlochen Arts Camp.

Sixteen year-old violinist FIA MANCINI has been playing the violin for nine years. Her former teachers include Jan Coleman, Christine Pastorek, Joyce Durfee, and she has been studying with Kenneth Goldsmith for the past three years. Fia has been a winner in the Jewish Community Center Competition, the Greater Houston Youth Orchestra Competition, the Houston Music Teacher's Association/Houston Youth Symphony Competition, and the Houston Young Artist's Competition. She is a junior currently attending the High School for the Performing and Visual Arts.
