BIOGRAPHY

DAVID COLSON graduated from the Interlochen Arts Academy where he was principal percussionist, timpanist, and concerto soloist. He received a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Michigan, and he founded and conducted the Current and Modern Consort, a new music ensemble based in Ann Arbor, Michigan. He received a Master of Arts degree from the University of Iowa where he was a member of the Center for New Music; he received the University's Philip Greeley Clapp Award.

David Colson received a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in composition from Rice University, and while there, formed the Pierrot Plus Ensemble, the University's contemporary music ensemble. In 1986, he was awarded the Sallie Shepherd Perkins Prize for "highest achievement in music" at Rice University. He has been a member of the music faculty at Coe College, Cornell College, and Rice University, and has taught at the University of Iowa. In addition, he was a member of the Toledo Symphony and the Northwood Orchestra. Currently Music Director of the Campanile Orchestra and Assistant Conductor of the Shepherd School Symphony Orchestra, David Colson is also a faculty artist at the Houston Community College and the University of St. Thomas. During the summer he is Associate Director and Associate Artist of the Colorado College Summer Conservatory and Music Festival.
