

Jones Schedules Closed Meeting To Consider Disbanding College

Jones College will hold a closed college meeting immediately after dinner tonight.

The purpose of the meeting, according to Joy Oppenheim, Jones President, is "to decide whether the members of Jones College are willing to make the individual committment of informed participation necessary

for the accomplishment of college goals."

Miss Oppenheim said that she also hoped that the members, if they are willing to make the necessary commitment, would decide "to what extent and in what ways" this commitment would be made. Or, if not willing, "why not and what are the alternatives?"

The meeting was originally to be the first in a series of regularly scheduled college meetings to allow the Jones members to get together to talk about their dissatisfactions, complaints, suggestions, and opinions.

Miss Oppenheim said that she called the meeting as a result of discussions on "how best to join the two wings of the college during which the question was initially raised of should the two wings really be joined."

She reported that it was gathered from the nature of things said at these discussions that "there was a certain reluctance, or at least hesitation, on the part of individual girls to commit themselves to the effort necessary to carry the college any further — or more basically should we have a college at all."
