CHAERIM KIM is a senior at Memorial High School. She was a member of the Houston Youth Symphony and is presently a member of the Greater Houston Youth Orchestra. She has participated in the Region XI, Area, and All-State Orchestras. She won fourth place in the Houston Music Teachers Association Concerto Competition, and an honorable mention in the Greater Houston Youth Orchestra Concerto Competition. She is a student of Kenneth Goldsmith, and her previous teachers include Pamela Klingensmith and Si-Yang Lao. She has participated in many summer camps, including Killington Music Festival, SMU-in-Taos, and ENCORE School for Strings, where she studied with Victor Danchenko. Last year Chaerim won the Southwest Region of the MTNA High School Concerto Competition and performed Bruch's Scottish Fantasy with the Waco Symphony Orchestra.

JOHANNA CHAN is thirteen years old and a freshman at Bellaire High School. She studied piano for six years beginning at the age of four and began her violin studies at the age of seven. In the past, she has been the winner of HMTA piano concerto competitions as well as the string concerto competition. She enjoys composing, and her works have won numerous awards including first place in the TMTA original composition in 1993. She has been a member of the Houston Youth Symphony for the past five years and has served as concertmaster in the Philharmonic and String Orchestras. Her former teachers include Jane Sugars for piano and Hong Chou for violin. She has been studying violin with Mr. Goldsmith since 1996.

KRISTI HELBERG began her violin studies in 1987 with Mary West at the McPhail Center of Music in Minneapolis. In 1993 she continued her studies in Houston with Inga Ingver, a Shepherd School graduate student, and began working with Kenneth Goldsmith in 1995. Last year she was the concerto winner for both the Clear Lake Symphony and the Greater Houston Youth Orchestra Competitions.
