Some of the important and unusual works you will hear are Messiaen's Quartet for the End of Time, Reynaldo Hahn's Piano Quintet (with violin faculty member Cho-Liang Lin), several works by Fauré including both Piano Quartets, the Piano Trio, the String Quartet and the Second Piano Quintet (with faculty pianist Brian Connelly), both Saint-Saëns String Quartets, brass music by Tomasi and Dukas, a Jean Françaix Wind Quintet, Ravel's Sonata for Violin and Cello and the Piano Trio, and Stravinsky's L'Histoire du Soldat with narrator! It will be a day to remember, one filled with this amazing music presented in the hands of our talented and committed Shepherd School students.
