

| ARMENIAN DANCES, PART I |
| The ARMENIAN DANCES is based on authentic Armenian folk |

songs from the collected works of Gomidas Vartabed (1869-1935), the founder of Armenian classical music. *Part I* is an extended symphonic rhapsody built upon five different songs which are freely treated and developed in terms of the modern concert band. The songs in order of their appearance in the score are:

The Apricot Tree--consists of three expressive songs which were transcribed in 1904. Alfred Reed has maintained the original rhythmic vitality combined with powerful wind scoring.

The Partridge's Song--originally arranged for solo voice is a delicate melody that is artistically arranged for a variety of the instruments throughout the band.

Hoy, My Nazen--is a lyric love song featuring dance rhythms, alternating meters and ornamentation.

Alagyas--(the name of a mountain in Armenia) was originally written by Gomidas for solo voice. Alfred Reed has utilized the full sonority of the concert band in his chorale scoring. Go, Go--is a humorous, light-textured tune. Reed has added driving tempo and rhythms to make this a fitting finale to Part I of the ARMENIAN DANCES.

Christina Carroll, a student of Phil Kraus of the Shepherd School of Music, is from Salina, Kansas. She has participated in Jazz Ensemble, Concert Band, and MOB throughout her tenure at Rice.
