She began studying the violin with Judy Offman at the Suzuki School of Houston and is continuing her studies with Kenneth Goldsmith in the Shepherd School Preparatory Program. Katherine has attended several summer music institutes, including Ottawa University Suzuki Institute, Encore/Coda in Maine, and the Rocky Mountain String Conservatory. She has participated in the Houston Youth Symphony, and for the past three years in the Greater Houston Youth Orchestra. In 1997 Katherine was selected to perform with the Woodlands Symphony at the Youth in Music evening.

SEO YUA PARK is nine years old and began her cello studies in Korea one year ago. She has been in the Shepherd School Preparatory Program studying with Lisa Vosdoganes since last May.

YOWEI SHAW is a fifth grader at Condit Elementary School. She is currently studying piano in the Shepherd School Preparatory Program with Jeanne Kierman Fischer. Before this summer, Yowei studied piano at Carnegie Mellon University's Preparatory School of Music beginning at age five. In 1996 and 1998 Yowei won Grand Prize and First Prize at the World Piano Competition presented by the American Music Scholarship Association in Cincinnati, Ohio. This October she will perform her winning piece in New York at Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall.

JOHANNA CHAN, fourteen years old, is a sophomore at Bellaire High School and a straight-A student. She studied piano for six years beginning at the age of four and began her violin studies at the age of seven. In the past, she has been the winner of HMTA piano concerto competitions and the string concerto competition. She enjoys composing, and her works have won numerous awards including first place in the TMTA competition for original composition in 1993. She has been a member of the Houston Youth Symphony for the past six years and has been awarded several merit scholarships for winning the competitions. She toured the west coast and Taiwan in the summer of 1996 as a member of the North America Elite Youth Orchestra. Johanna was chosen as a member of the All-Region Symphony and the All-State Symphony in 1998. In the summer of 1998, she studied violin with Vartan Manoogian and Stephanie Sant' Ambrogio at Madeline Island

Music Camp on Madeline Island, Wisconsin. While at the music camp, Johanna's quartet won the award as the most outstanding quartet and was invited to perform in Minneapolis, Minnesota, in September of 1998. Johanna has studied violin with Hong Chou and is currently in the Shepherd School Preparatory Program studying with Kenneth Goldsmith.

ELIZABETH (Liz) GULLIVER LUNDE, seventeen years old, was born in St. Louis, Missouri, and has played the violin for seven years. After moving to Houston in 1994, Liz studied violin with Eric Halen of the Houston Symphony. Since August 1997, she has been in the Shepherd School Preparatory Program studying with Kenneth Goldsmith. In 1998 she placed third in the HMTA Senior Violin Competition. Currently she is in the National Honor Society and the Latin National Honor Society at Cypress Falls High School, where she is a senior. Her college goal is to study music.
