Recording credits include an appearance as the boy soprano soloist in the National Symphony Orchestra's recording of John Corigliano's Of Rage and Remembrance.

KIRA AUSTIN-YOUNG is a junior from Dallas. She attended high school for two years at the Interlochen Arts Academy in Michigan. A student of Kathleen Kaun, she has been active for the past two years in the Rice Light Opera Society, where she performed the roles of Edith in **The Pirates of Penzance** and Lady Jane in **Patience**. She performed the role of Hansel in **Hansel and Gretel** last fall at the Shepherd School.

LINDSAY BOULWARE is a second-year graduate student at the Shepherd School. A native of Amarillo, Texas, she has performed numerous times with the Amarillo Opera and the Amarillo Symphony.
