Seventeen-year-old violinist YIYING JULIA LI began her music studies at age six. After a year of participation in a group class, she started private violin lessons with Professor Shengyin Huang at the Central Conservatory of China in Beijing. By age ten, Li had won first place in the regional arts competitions and third place in the Beijing City's Violin Competition.

After moving to the United States at age eleven, Li started lessons with Bingsun Yang, her teacher of five years. Li previously was a member and served as concertmaster of such orchestras in the community as the Virtuosi of Houston and the Houston Youth Symphony (HYS). At age thirteen, Li received second prize in the concerto competition hosted by the Virtuosi of Houston. At age fourteen, she won a competition at HYS and performed with the symphony. In that same year Li's quartet, Camerata String Quartet, won the grand prize in the first annual Chamber Music International Festival Competition. At age fifteen, Li won the concerto competition with HSPVA symphony and a chance to perform with them. Most recently she received third prize in the Houston Symphony League Concerto Competition.

Li was a two-year participant of the Baylor University Summer Quartet Conference and Meadowmount School of Music, where she studied with Amy Barlowe, and in 2004 performed in a master class for Ruggiero Ricci. She recently attended the Encore School for Strings this summer, where she studied with Robert Lipsett. She is a two-year scholarship recipient of the Dorothy Richard Starling Foundation for summer music studies. Li was also a four-year participant of the Houston Young Artists' Concert, and her chamber group was chosen twice to perform in the NPR radio program "Front Row." Last winter, Li was chosen as a participant for the New York String Orchestra Seminar. Under Jaime Laredo's direction, the orchestra performed two concerts at Carnegie Hall with Jonathan Biss and Hilary Hahn.

Li currently studies with Professor Kenneth Goldsmith at the Michael P. Hammond Preparatory Program of the Shepherd School of Music.
